2. Geschichte: The concept that he was resurrected


PROPOSITION: Christ did not actually die on the cross, which allowed him to later "rise from the dead."





OBJECTION 1: The beating Christ received was alone likely too severe for him to survive.

Eusebius described the Roman flogging saying: "the sufferers veins were laid bare, and the very muscels, sinews, and bowels of the victim were open to exposure."



OBJECTION 3: Christ's appearance to his disciples would not have been motivating Had he not been resurrected his natural body would not have been the picture of one who conquered death - How would he have walked around with such wounds?



OBJECTION 4: Essential aspects of the Gospel require Christ's death

<u>Romans 5:6-8</u>


You see, at just the right time, when we were still powerless, Christ died for the ungodly. 7 Very rarely will anyone die for a righteous man, though for a good man someone might possibly dare to die. 8 But God demonstrates his own love for us in this: While we were still sinners, Christ died for us.



PROPOSITION: The grave was in some way tampered with to remove the body


